Celebrate the Life of Leslie Feinberg Anti-Racist Transgender Warrior

For over 50 years Leslie Feinberg, an anti-Zionist, transgender warrior in the LGBTQI community fought for justice. Leslie, who identified as an antiracist white, workingclass, secular Jewish, transgender, lesbian, female, revolutionary communist, died on November 15. She succumbed to

complications from multiple tick-borne co-infections, including Lyme disease, after decades of illness.

Feinberg's 1993 first novel, *Stone Butch Blues* won the Lambda Literary Award and the 1994 American Library Association Gay & Lesbian Book Award. Feinberg authored *Trans Liberation: Beyond Pink or Blue* and *Transgender Warriors: Making History*; the novel *Drag King Dreams*; and *Rainbow Solidarity in Defense of Cuba*.

Feinberg was a member of Workers World Party and a managing editor of *Workers World* newspaper.

Feinberg was working with her life partner of 22 years, Minnie Bruce Pratt, on publishing a 20th anniversary edition of *Stone Butch Blues*. The online edition will be dedicated to CeCe McDonald and contain a slideshow called "This Is What Solidarity Looks Like" documenting the Free CeCe campaign.
