Fight "Rate Design" Rate Hikes

- ✓ CPUC proposed decision would change the Four-tier pricing structure to a Two-tier system. This will reward energy hogs and punish those who conserve.
- ✓ CPUC proposed decision is urging the commission to approve a \$10 fixed charge per month on YOUR energy bill. A fixed charge would hurt low-income families where every dollar saved matters the most!

Additional Points:

- ✓ Practically all CARE Customers Will Get Higher Bills!
 CPUC proposal increases the baseline rate & adopts two-tiers that raises monthly bills for CARE Customers.
- ✓ Practically all PG&E customers will Get Higher Bills!
 Approximately 75-80% non-CARE customers would receive bill increases
- ✓ High Energy Users Will Get Lower Bills!

 Energy hogs get a discount on the backs of people who conserve energy.
- ✓ This will hurt all current and potential solar customers!

 Adding on a fixed fee would make it less likely for customers to go solar
