ALL OF US enjoy the fruits of labor's struggles over the years:

the 8-hour day, social security, unemployment insurance, vacations, sick leave, etc.

Strong unions set a pay standard that non-union employers follow.

For example, a high school graduate whose workplace is not unionized, but whose *industry* is even 25% unionized, is paid 5% more than similar workers in less unionized industries.

Unions have a big impact on our pay and work lives.

Unions raise wages of unionized workers by roughly 20%, and raise compensation, including both wages and benefits, by about 28%.

We ALL deserve to have strong unions to protect our livelihoods.

just as the Chamber of Commerce and the Committee for Jobs do for their constituents.

Who's being greedy? BART is paying a union-busting negotiator \$399,000 and \$36,000 in personal expenses, while asking BART workers making \$62,000 maximum to give up healthcare and safe working conditions. This is part of a nationwide attack on all workers, pitting one against another. DON'T LET THIS HAPPEN.
